Report Out on Secretary Augustus meeting with the Network

Thanks to the outreach by Rep. Aaron Saunders (Ludlow and other towns), HLC Secretary Ed Augustus met with roughly 50 Network partners (other legislators, mayors and city/town staff, EA shelter and individual shelter providers) to discuss the most pressing homelessness issues in the region. Pamela noted that the concerns raised in these family services meetings very much played a role in informing this conversation with the Secretary. In effect, EVERYONE showed up! Stay tuned for any follow-up steps or actions.

Shelter updates

EA shelters are seeing an increase in "90 day length of stay letters" informing families that they have 90 days to vacate the shelter. Several shelter providers received as many as 13 notices at the first of the month. This is stressful! Extensions are being requested.

In some instances, families have completed all the paperwork for a move, and it's the HomeBASE payment that is being held up, creating the delay. We are pushing HLC to address this gap.

On the rehousing front, Janette shared that in this first quarter alone, western MA rehoused 282 families with HomeBASE. That is compared to last year's TOTAL figure of 369. Great work is happening!

Election fall-out: families are very worried about what will happen in January; some wondering whether they are supposed to leave the country before then. A scary time for many families.

RAFT: applications are still very high, over 125-150/week.

Secure Jobs Update re: ESOL classes: Jasmin shared the innovative program started by Way Finders' Secure Jobs program: to partner with shelters and HCC to bring HCC ESOL classes to Way Finders to make it easier for people to participate in them. The program is so successful that they have applied for additional funding be able to offer courses for the next 2 years.
